GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Performs moderately complex (journey-level) transportation operations or maintenance support work. Work involves performing a variety of transportation operation or maintenance activities. Works under general supervision, with limited latitude for the use of initiative and independent judgment.

EXAMPLES OF WORK PERFORMED

Performs a variety of transportation operation or maintenance activities.

Verifies and maintains records of the cost of work performed, materials, and supplies used on projects.

Checks materials, grades, and other factors in ensuring conformance to plans and specifications.

Prepares regular and special reports.

May assist in the maintenance and repair of marine vessels, machinery, equipment, systems, or components.

May issue driveway and utility permits.

May inspect and evaluate operating machinery, equipment, and systems.

May read and interpret blueprints, sketches, and schematic diagrams.

May be responsible for the proper line-up, start, operation, and securing of main equipment and related systems for the operation of motor ferry vessels.

Performs related work as assigned.

GENERAL QUALIFICATION GUIDELINES

EXPERIENCE AND EDUCATION

Experience in highway construction, maintenance, and repair work. Graduation from a standard senior high school or equivalent is generally preferred. Experience and education may be substituted for one another.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

Knowledge of highway construction and/or marine vessel maintenance, repair, and operation; and departmental plans and specifications.

Skill in the use of highway maintenance equipment, in troubleshooting situations, and in identifying appropriate solutions.

Ability to coordinate the schedule of work sequences, to interpret plans and specifications, to work effectively with the public, and to communicate effectively.

REGISTRATION, CERTIFICATION, OR LICENSURE

May be required to be licensed in a specialty area.
