


# 542 - Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas

Workforce Summary Document prepared by the State Auditor's Office.  
Based on information **self-reported** by the agency, the following items are worth noting.

## Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees

The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation decreased by 33.3 percent to 24.0 FTEs in fiscal year 2012 compared to fiscal year 2011. Compared to fiscal year 2009, the agency saw an increase of 14.5 FTEs (193.9 percent) in the total number of FTEs. House Bill 14 (80th Legislature) created this agency in fiscal year 2009; the FTEs of the Cancer Council was transferred to this agency.






## Employee Turnover<sup>a</sup>


Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (5.3 percent) was lower than the statewide turnover rate (17.3 percent) and lower than the turnover rate of Article I agencies (11.4 percent) during fiscal year 2012. The fiscal year 2012 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 10.7 percent.



## Compensation Information<sup>a</sup>

The average agency salary in fiscal year 2012 of \$89,569 represented an increase of 33.1 percent compared to the average agency salary in fiscal year 2009. In fiscal year 2012, 34.7 percent of employees were paid below the salary range midpoints in which they were assigned; and expenditures for salary and benefits were higher compared to fiscal year 2009.



### Agency Job Classifications






## Fiscal Year 2012 Workforce Demographics<sup>b</sup>



The agency was created in fiscal year 2009; therefore, 100.0 percent of employees have less than 5 years of agency service. On average, employees at the agency were 47.5 years of age and had 2.7 years of agency length of service. Of the agency's employees, 74.7 percent were 40 years of age or older.

## Survey of Employee Engagement<sup>c</sup>

The Survey of Employee Engagement, administered by The University of Texas at Austin, is an instrument that measures employees' job satisfaction and employees' perceptions of the effectiveness of the agency. Scores range from 1 to 5, with 5 being the highest. The agency did not participate in the survey.
