
Workforce Summary Document Prepared by the State Auditor's Office.

Based on a review of information self-reported by the institution, the following items are worth noting.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees

Texas A&M University - Central Texas became a stand-alone university on May 27, 2009, and the institution did not report FTEs separately from Tarleton State University until fiscal year 2012. The institution's full-time equivalent employee limitation increased by 8.2 percent to 133.9 FTEs in fiscal year 2014 compared to fiscal year 2013. As of August 31, 2014, 3.1 FTEs were administrator positions.

In fiscal year 2014, 47.7 percent of FTEs were paid from non-appropriated funds. Only FTEs paid from appropriated funds count against the FTE limitation.




Employee Turnover^a

In fiscal year 2014, the total turnover rate for the institution was 21.5 percent. This was higher than in fiscal year 2013, when the total turnover rate was 12.6 percent. The turnover rate in fiscal year 2014 for administrators (0.0 percent) was the same as in fiscal year 2013, turnover for faculty positions (12.1 percent) was higher than in fiscal year 2013, and turnover for staff positions (27.8 percent) was higher than in fiscal year 2013.


Turnover Rates




Administrator Separations

Staff Separations





Compensation Information^b


The average salary for staff employees decreased by 4.5 percent and for administrators it decreased by 5.8 percent when compared to the average salaries in fiscal year 2013. Compared to fiscal year 2010, salary and benefits expenditures increased by 30.9 percent.

In fiscal year 2014, the president's salary was \$225,000. This salary increased from fiscal year 2013, when the president's salary was \$200,000.


Administrator and Staff Average Salaries

In fiscal year 2014, the institution used appropriated funds to pay for 100.0 percent of administrator merit increases, 98.0 percent of faculty merit increases, and 60.0 percent of staff merit increases.


Fiscal Year 2014 Workforce Demographics^b

Summary


Of the institution's administrators, 72.7 percent were 40 years of age and older, and of the institution's staff employees, 63.2 percent were 40 years of age or older. The average length of employment at the institution for administrators was 8.5 years, and for staff employees it was 4.2 years.

In fiscal year 2014, 63.5 percent of faculty FTEs with teaching responsibility were tenured or tenure-track.


Age: Administrator and Staff
