

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees


The agency's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation increased by 3.0 percent to 34.0 FTEs in fiscal year 2016 compared to fiscal year 2015. Compared to fiscal year 2012, the agency saw an increase of 2.5 (7.7 percent) in the total number of FTEs. While FTE limitations are set for the appellate courts, they are for informational purposes only.



Employee Turnover^a


Excluding interagency transfers, the turnover rate within the agency (10.1 percent) was lower than the statewide turnover rate (17.6 percent) and lower than the turnover rate of Article IV agencies (12.0 percent) during fiscal year 2016. The fiscal year 2016 agency turnover rate including employees who transferred to another state agency or higher education institution was 10.1 percent.





Compensation Information

The average agency salary in fiscal year 2016 of \$70,674 represented an increase of 21.3 percent compared to the average agency salary in fiscal year 2012. In fiscal year 2016, 16.8 percent of employees were paid below the midpoint of the salary range in which they were assigned; and total agency expenditures for salary and benefits were higher compared to fiscal year 2012.
