



Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees


This institution was established on May 21, 2015. House Bill 1051 (84th Legislature, Regular Session) created this institution. Prior to fiscal year 2017, information on full-time equivalent employees was included in the information reported for the Texas State Technical College - Marshall. As of August 31, 2018, 3.0 FTEs were administrator positions.

Prior to fiscal year 2017, FTE data were reported with Texas State Technical College - Marshall.




Employee Turnover ^{a b}

In fiscal year 2018, the total turnover rate for the institution was 18.5 percent. This was lower than in fiscal year 2017, when the total turnover rate was 23.3 percent. The turnover rate in fiscal year 2018 for administrators (0.0 percent) was the same as fiscal year 2017, turnover for faculty positions (25.6 percent) was lower than in fiscal year 2017, and turnover for staff positions (13.8 percent) was lower than in fiscal year 2017. Prior to fiscal year 2017, information on turnover was included in the information reported for the Texas State Technical College - Marshall.


Turnover Rates




Administrator Separations

Staff Separations





Compensation Information ^{b c}

Compared to the average salaries in fiscal year 2017, the average salary for staff employees decreased by 3.3 percent and for administrators it was unchanged. Prior to fiscal year 2017, information on compensation was included in the information reported for the Texas State Technical College - Marshall.

During fiscal year 2016, the separate accreditations and operations of the Texas State Technical College System were merged to form a single college. Consequently, there is a single administration and chief executive across the statewide college. In fiscal year 2018, the provost's salary was \$99,000.






Fiscal Year 2018 Workforce Demographics and Veteran Employment ^{b c}

Of the institution's administrators, 100.0 percent were 40 years of age or older, and of the institution's staff employees, 63.3 percent were 40 years of age or older. The average length of employment at the institution for administrators was 11.5 years, and for staff employees it was 4.7 years. The average length of service includes the service time working for the institution when its data was previously reported with Texas State Technical College – Marshall.

Effective fiscal year 2016, Texas Government Code, Section 657.004, sets for higher education institutions a goal of employing veterans in full-time positions equal to at least 20.0 percent of the total number of institution employees.

Veteran Employment is included in the information reported for the Texas State Technical College System Administration.
