

# 926 - Texas State Technical College - Marshall

Workforce Summary Document Prepared by the State Auditor's Office.  
Based on a review of information **self-reported** by the institution, the following items are noteworthy.


## Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Employees

The institution's full-time equivalent (FTE) employee limitation increased by 55.8 percent to 146.1 FTEs in fiscal year 2018 compared to fiscal year 2017 (see table below). Prior to fiscal year 2017, FTE data included both Texas State Technical College - Marshall and Texas State Technical College - North Texas, which became a stand-alone institution on May 21, 2015. As of August 31, 2018, 3.0 FTEs were administrator positions. The institution's 96.4 total FTEs represents a decrease of 21.9 (18.5 percent) in the total number of FTEs since fiscal year 2014.

In fiscal year 2018, 6.6 percent of FTEs were paid from non-appropriated funds. This was a decrease of 48.0 percent in FTEs paid from non-appropriated funds since fiscal year 2014 (see bar chart to the right). Only FTEs paid from appropriated funds counted against the FTE limitation.




## Employee Turnover <sup>a b</sup>

In fiscal year 2018, the total turnover rate for the institution was 30.1 percent. This was higher than in fiscal year 2017, when the total turnover rate was 17.6 percent. The turnover rate in fiscal year 2018 for administrators (33.3 percent) was higher than in fiscal year 2017, turnover for faculty positions (41.1 percent) was higher than in fiscal year 2017, and turnover for staff positions (18.8 percent) was higher than in fiscal year 2017.


### Turnover Rates




### Administrator Separations



## Compensation Information <sup>b c</sup>


Compared to the average salaries in fiscal year 2017, the average salary for staff employees decreased by 2.1 percent and for administrators it increased by 13.2 percent.

During fiscal year 2016, the separate accreditations and operations of the Texas State Technical College System were merged to form a single college. Consequently, there is a single administration and chief executive across the statewide college. In fiscal year 2018, the provost's salary was \$123,000.

## Fiscal Year 2018 Workforce Demographics and Veteran Employment <sup>b c</sup>

Of the institution's administrators, 100.0 percent were 40 years of age or older, and of the institution's staff employees, 72.4 percent were 40 years of age or older. The average length of employment at the institution for administrators was 6.3 years, and for staff employees it was 6.0 years.



Veteran Employment is included in the information reported for the Texas State Technical College System Administration.




### Age: Administrator and Staff
